A national conference on *Poetics of the Self: The Art of Autobiography* will be held at the University of New Brunswick, Fredericton, April 28-30, 1995. This conference, organized by and for PhD students, will provide a scholarly forum in which graduate students can articulate and exchange their ideas on autobiographical literature.

The conference will explore historical, social, political, critical and creative approaches to autobiography. Submissions may address one of the following areas: autobiography and post-colonialism, biographical editorialship, fictive autobiography, autobiography and feminism, autobiography and travel, and early antecedents to biographical writing.

Through the process of blind vetting, papers will be selected by a national board composed of professors of literature, and those accepted for presentation will be considered for publication.
