# Essays in Critical Dissent

**F. W. Bateson**

In the twenty-four sceptical essays collected here, F. W. Bateson tackles the modern 'Eng. Lit. industry' with his customary vigour and wit. The longest section, *The Philistinism of Research*, attacks the various tendencies in the scholarly study of English literature today — source hunting, analytical bibliography, the linguistic approach — that attempt to apply to it the methods of science irrespective of aesthetic considerations; a further section is intended to illustrate the central role of an author's intentions in literature. The collection ends with some consideration of the teaching and examination of English literature at the modern university. Together they make a spirited polemic.

The essays, revised for this collection, are drawn from a wide variety of sources, English, American and European; two articles and the Introduction have been specially written and appear for the first time.
