## Issues of Language

ARIEL will devote its next special number (due in 1984) to issues of language. Submissions on such topics as the role of the vernacular in literatures in English or their relation to those in other languages in multi-language cultures are invited, as are practical textual or intertextual studies and theoretical studies of the function of language in text.
