Sam Selvon, a Caribbean writer living in Canada, has become a pioneer in the use of dialect in narration. This study is a literary analysis of Selvon's use of Trinidad Creole English as an important component of his style and method of fictional composition. Wyke follows the development of Selvon's writing from his early to his late career, starting with his first novel, A Brighter Sun (1952), and finishing with Moses Migrating (1983). This book will introduce new readers to the works of Selvon and will appeal particularly to those interested in the connection between the Caribbean, Canada, and Britain — places where Selvon has lived and from where he draws his rich material. \$35.95
