All articles are refereed blind (authorship unattributed) by at least two readers; consequently, names of contributors should appear *only* on the title page of manuscripts and not as a running head on each page. An abstract and keywords must be provided. The editors require assurance that authors are not offering their articles concurrently elsewhere.
